

 - MTA & FTA are reviewing comments and prepare responses
- Record of Decision (ROD)
 - ROD includes:
 - Environmental commitments from the FEIS
 - Comments
 - FTA and MTA's response to the comments

Public-Private Partnership

- Common in Canada and Europe
 - Increasingly common here
- MTA will retain ownership of the Purple Line
- Design-Build-Finance-Operate-Maintain
 - Approximately a 30-year O&M term with hand back
- Performance-Based Technical Provisions

P3 Basics

- Life Cycle Cost Considerations
 - Responsible for operations, maintenance, replacement
- Capture Innovation and Cost/Schedule Savings
- Milestone Payments during construction
- Availability Payments
 - Operation & maintenance costs
 - Capital debt
 - Financing cost
 - Profit/Risk coverage
 - Performance

Why P3 for Purple?

- Self-contained from existing MTA operations
- Appropriate size for concessionaires to bid
- Enough complexity for innovation
- Reasonable risk allocation
- Good value for money

MTA Areas of Responsibility

- MTA plans to retain primary responsibility for:
 - Public information, communications and outreach, marketing
 - General terms of third party agreements
 - Right-of-way Acquisition
 - Fare policy, regional coordination and collection
 - Policing (mutual-aid)






Station Design - Bethesda



















Capital Crescent Trail
